March 17, 2022


Every state has until March 17, 2022 to come into compliance with the Final Rule.

Think of the HCBS Final Rule as a Recipe



The ingredients are the different requirements that make up the HCBS final rule...

Result of Adding the Ingredients =



People living in their communities,

having more experiences,

making their own choices and...

(oh yeah, by the way)

now the services and supports being provided are in compliance with the HCBS final rule!

The setting is integrated, and supports full access of individuals receiving services to the greater community to the same degree of access as individuals not receiving services.





The setting is *selected by the individual* from among setting options [available], including non-disability-specific settings and an option for a private unit in a residential setting.




The setting ensures an individual's rights of privacy, dignity and respect, as well as freedom from coercion and restraint.





The setting optimizes, but does not regiment, individual initiative, autonomy, and **independence in making life choices**, including but not limited to: <u>daily activities</u>, <u>physical environment</u>, and with <u>whom to interact</u>.





The setting **facilitates individual choice** regarding services and supports, and who provides them.



The unit or dwelling is a specific physical place that can be owned, rented or occupied under a **legally enforceable agreement** by the individual receiving services.




Each individual has **privacy** in their sleeping or living unit; including **doors lockable** by individual, **choice of a roommate** if sharing a unit, and the **freedom to furnish and decorate** their sleeping or living units within the lease or other agreement.





Individuals have the freedom and support to control
their own schedules and activities, and have access
to food any time.



Individuals are able to have visitors of their choosing at any time.





The setting is **physically accessible** to the individual.

Due Dates for HCBS 2018 Projects

- Deadline 1/5/18 (Enclosure C) for proposals to be submitted to Program Evaluators
- DDS will inform providers of status of application by March of 2018.
- DDS will provide the final approval by March of 2018, but the regional center will be responsible for dispersing the approved funding to the service provider.

**** (If a provider is vendored for multiple regional centers for a service, the provider only needs to submit one proposal, but they will need to mention the regional centers in the narrative).
