North Bay Regional Center assists individuals with, or at risk for, a developmental disability obtain services and supports they need to live independent and productive lives.

North Bay Regional Center is one of 21 non-profit, community-based Regional Centers in California. Regional Centers were established in 1965. Legislation sponsored by Assemblyman Frank Lanterman, which later became known as The Lanterman Act, ensured individuals with a developmental disability the right to choose where to live, work, and participate in leisure activities.

North Bay Regional Center serves over 8000 people living within Sonoma, Solano, and Napa Counties.

Early Start

EARLY START intervention services are available to families of infants and toddlers from birth to age 3 with one (or more) of the following conditions:

- Born with a condition which has a high probability of resulting in a developmental delay, such as Down Syndrome, OR ...
- If under 24 months, a significant (33%) age delay must exist in ONE developmental area: communication, gross/fine motor, social/emotional, self-help, and/or cognitive skills.
- If over 24 months, a 33% age delay in TWO developmental areas, or a 50% delay in one area must exist.
- Severe vision, hearing or orthopedic impairments.

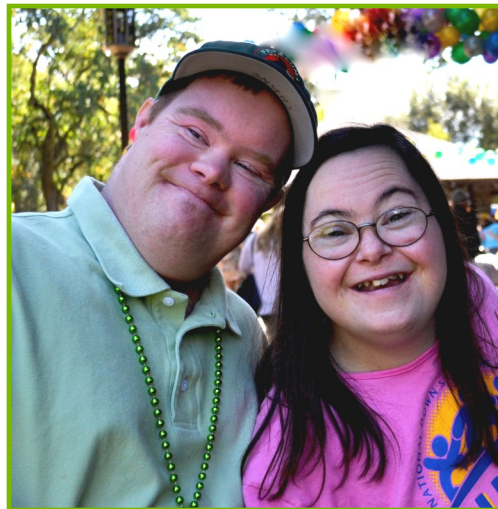
Services may include:

- Assessment, Infant development, speech and language services, physical and occupational therapy.

Regional Center Eligibility

Regional center services are available for individuals over the age of 3 who have a developmental disability. The developmental disability must occur before the age of 18, be expected to continue indefinitely, and cause a substantial disability*. A developmental disability is:

- Autism
- Cerebral Palsy
- Epilepsy
- Intellectual Disability
- Other disabling conditions closely related to Intellectual Disability or that require similar treatment as for individuals with Intellectual Disability



Services

A Service Coordinator assists in creating an Individual Program Plan (IPP). The IPP process helps individuals and families make informed choices about the services and supports needed to lead more independent and productive lives.

Services contracted by NBRC may include:

- Adaptive Skills Training
- Parent Training in Behavior Intervention
- Nursing Services
- Residential Services
- Respite
- Day Care Supplemental Services
- Independent Living Services
- Supported Employment
- Supported Living Services
- Transportation Access Plans
- Adult Work & Day Programs

How much does this cost?

There is no charge for assessment services or for service coordination.

Certain services may be subject to a share of cost and annual fee.

Regional centers must exhaust all other possible sources of funding before services can be purchased.
