CALL TO ORDER – Harry Matthews, President, called the meeting to order at 5:17 p.m. Roll was called and a quorum was present. Board and audience introduced themselves.

CONSIDERATION OF MINUTES

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

- August 14th the Board will participate in an all-day training retreat. There will be no Board meeting for the month of August
- Micheline Justman noted that NBRC is hosting an all staff picnic on July 24th.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

- A. Executive Committee Harry Matthews No meeting
- B. Vendor Advisory Committee (VAC) Mike Huckins

The VAC met on Tuesday, May 12, 2015. Please refer to the minutes for the complete report. Group reports were given:

- The Sonoma Vendor Group met and had wrap up discussion from the Legislative breakfast as well as the vendor survey.
- Public Relations and Outreach: We will coordinate our vendor fair with the All NBRC Staff training day this Fall.
- Trade Associations: Linda reported on the CSLN conference is April 15th 17th and the wonderful wedding of 2 consumers officiated by Holly Mitchell. CSLN is in support of AB 286, the SLS 15 hours of Behavioral Training if it is funded. Everyone needs to contact the Governor related to the 10 Campaign. Mike reported that the California Respite Association has a draft of trailer bill /

language to help fund the unfunded mandates such as the City specific minimum wage increases which currently require a DDS health and safety exception. SB 490 would allow vendors with a good audit to skip the following 2 years, but as Bob Hamilton pointed out would probably pay more because of the back year auditing required. Vendor Relations Committee: VAC Members continue to meet with Michi to help NBRC better understand what is happening in the vendor community as well as helping Vendors better understand NBRC processes and policies. A Vendor survey related to Regional Center is being sent out soon for a June 16th VAC summary report.

- Board Report: January Crane did an excellent presentation on the risk and statistics related to
 mortality with our NBRC Consumer population. Mike noted that the NBRC Consumer overall
 number of deaths per year is statistically the same as the general population. The Board approved
 the Uniform Holiday Schedule for Fiscal Year 2015/16 with corrections on the December 24th and
 25, 2015 and the May 30, 2016 dates. The work of the Vendor Relations Committee was noted
 and appreciated.
- ARCA/NBRC: Bob stated that the next ARCA meeting will be on June 3rd at the Regional Center of the East Bay at 500 Davis Street, San Leandro. Management staff met on 5/11 to discuss ways for SLS and IHSS to avoid being considered co-employers. One way is to not to match the IHSS wage with a different SLS wage. NBRC is working hard on increasing staffing at NBRC. Bob recommended viewing specific hearing video on Cal Channel. He is also hopeful that McGuire will support the rate increase in the budget conference process. Michi reported that NBRC will be hiring a Board Certified Behavioral Analyst. She described the process that will take place in recruiting representatives for the self-directed services committee by July 1st. An updated organizational chart was provided. An update was also provided on the Medicaid Waiver Audit in progress. Policy and Procedure Changes: Other than the uniform holiday schedule, Courtney stated that NBRC will continue its practice of mailing out a full summary CDER. The ILS policy is awaiting DDS approval.

New Business: The VAC is considering a number of candidates for 4 vacant VAC member slots. Next VAC Meeting: The next VAC Meeting will be on June 16th.

The VAC met on Tuesday, June 16, 2015. Please refer to the minutes for the complete report.

Community Concerns/Clarifications: Survey: Elizabeth Clary, UCP North Bay, presented the initial response from the vendor survey to assist in sharing thoughts, ideas, and impressions on how it is going with our work with NBRC. There were 31 responses to date and more time will be given for additional responses. Michi stated that the information is very helpful.

Vendor Concern: Allan Maroun with Wheelcare Express stated his concern that they have been denied \$3,500 over several months in funding due to concerns with overbilling. Isabel Calder strongly encouraged Wheelcare Express to set up a meeting as she believes this is a contractual issue. Group reports were given:

- The Napa Solano Vendor Group met and discussed sick leave pay, advocacy updates, and policy updates such as the non-referral list. Concerns related to the latter, should be communicated to Maura McDonough.
- NBHC: Mary Eble stated there are 4 bills in play that would help with housing. LA Times featured
 an article about the California Supreme Court requiring developers to have a certain amount of
 affordable housing with new developments. NBHC is a member of a variety of organizations
 including development, Housing Alliance, Lanterman Housing Alliance and Napa's Housing
 Opportunities and Landlord Engagement Committee. Mary will forward a survey to Linda for vendor
 completion.
- Public Relations and Outreach: September 28th is the All NBRC Staff training day this Fall when we will have our vendor fair.
- Trade Associations: Linda reported on the budget conference committees' proposed budget for
 potential rate increases for our community services. She also stated that a representative of the
 Obama administration has indicated that the Wage Order 15 overtime exemption is not likely to
 remain in place much longer.

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- Board Report: The Annual meeting featured proud moments about a number of consumers we serve. It was great to hear about how adaptive equipment was helping some as well as how well one Consumer was doing at her community care facility after living in SDC for seventy years! Mike called out the NBRC staff who were celebrating their 10th, 20th and 30th work anniversaries.
- ARCA/NBRC: Bob stated that the next ARCA meeting will be on June 19th. He stated that he is
 most concerned about what happens with trailer bill language related to the potential community
 service rate increase and other unfunded mandates. He mentioned the large number of rallies that
 are occurring on 6/17 statewide. He reiterated that the rate freeze needs to be lifted and mentioned
 that could occur through capitation of services.
- Director of Client Services Report: Michi Gates stated that Ari Neman will be the featured presenter at the All Day Staff training on September 28th at Sonoma Veterans Hall. SLS Task Force met and expressed concerns about how this would work with Self Determination. Fortunately San Diego representation, who was part of the Self Determination pilot, was there to help diminish these fears. The self-determination committee will have its first meeting on June 30th. Family Home Agencies will be audited under the direction of Maura. Until cancelled POSs are not in compliance with contracts so there will be some adjustments to POS end dates as POSs are renewed. Kelley Hanson with PACE stated that nursing related services have become a challenge at PACE; Michi wants to know when clinical staff related services like this are causing POS related problems. NBRC continues to hire new staff to keep the caseload ratio below 90. The Organizational Chart is updated every 2 weeks on the NBRC website. Maura provided a detailed update on upcoming trainings including: HIPAA, DOL, New Provider Training, Bed Bugs, Pneumonia, SIR and Quality Assurance and Restraints.

New Business: The VAC has had an overwhelming response for 4 vacant VAC member slots. VAC representatives will be meeting with Candidates this summer.

Mike will chair the July meeting and after some discussion the August VAC meeting was cancelled to coincide with NBRC Board not having a meeting that month.

Next VAC Meeting: The next VAC Meeting will be on Tuesday, July 14, 2015.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Michi Gates, Director, Client Services, Report:

- Michi noted the Satisfaction Survey that was developed by the Vendor Advisory Committee. Michi
 commended the VAC for great survey questions. The Committee hasn't had a chance to meet to
 review the survey results. Will report back when that task is completed.
- Michi attended the Dooley Developmental Center Taskforce on June 5th. Secretary Dooley noted there is no available money for operations, rate increases, or the Developmental Center system. Discussion regarding recommendations of the rate group followed. Secretary Dooley noted that the focus has to be on changing the way services are delivered within the system. Even though there are no funds, a prioritized list needs to be developed so when there are available funds that list will be readily available.
- The State budget looks good in terms of POS dollars but without rate reform it really doesn't help
 much. If vendors continue to receive minimum wage to provide services and we are unable to go
 above the cap because of the frozen rates, it doesn't do much good. The legislature doesn't seem
 to understand that.
- In need of a State operated facility that cannot say "no" for clients who have intense needs.
- Special session: The 10% rate increase for minimum wage was refused by the Governor. The
 recommendation by the Senate and Assembly for different kinds of adjustments was also refused
 by the Governor. A Special Sessions will be held regarding the Developmental Center system
 looking for ways to increase funding without coming out of the General Fund. They are looking at
 possibly adding an additional tax on MediCal to provide funds for our system. The 10% campaign
 was not wasted as it brought the Regional Center System to the forefront.

- The rates workgroup was not to ask for more money but provide a different design for the rate structure.
- Michi attended the Statewide Forensic forum hosted by ARCA through the Mental Health Care Service Act along with other regional centers. The meeting was specifically to discuss ways to provide services and supports to clients with forensic needs. Judges were also able to express their concerns which was enlightening. Next meeting will be held in September.
- Self Determination Advisory Committee: The first advisory committee meeting was held on June 30th. State Council on Developmental Disabilities and the Regional Center will each appoint five people, as well as a representative from Disability Rights. The makeup of committee is to reflect demographics, ethnicity, as well as have family members or clients on the committee. Even though the first advisory committee meeting was held, NBRC still has three vacancies available, with a specific need in Sonoma County. The meeting will be rotated according to where committee members reside. NBRC is waiting for the Centers for Medicaid Services to approve the DDS plan for the Self Determination program.
- Behavioral Health Treatment Services was supposed to transition to MediCal in September so NBRC clients under 21 who receive Behavioral Health Treatment Services can potentially transition to services funded through MediCal. The Department of Health Care Services and DDS have postponed until November to allow more time for the transition.
- Proposed changes to the Department of Health Care Services guidelines for approving funding for sedation dentistry. If the changes go forward it will have a huge impact on NBRC clients. Our Dental Coordinator, Alisha Guiterrez, has been working feverishly. She wrote a letter on behalf of NBRC making recommendations and expressing concern regarding the proposed guidelines. ARCA also composed a letter on behalf of all Regional Centers to the Department of Health Care Services with their recommendations. The proposed guidelines identify more steps and assessments to qualify for services. Rate reform is needed for DentiCal and MediCal. Discussion followed.
- NBRC exceeded the number of individuals needed to add to Medicaid waiver. This means NBRC
 will not lose any Operations funding. Michi commended January and her team for all the hard work
 involved in making this happen. Michi also commended the Service Coordinators because without
 them the Federal Revenue team could not complete their job.
- Michi attended the Sonoma Coalition SDC Transformation meeting organized by DDS, i.e., Sonoma Land Trust, Sonoma County Supervisor Susan Gorin, legislators, parents and family members etc. An all-day meeting on Saturday was held to receive input from families affected by the closure of SDC. Fear and concern was prevalent in comments/input received by those in attendance. Parents don't want SDC to close. The Parents Hospital Association (PHA) sent a representative to inform those in attendance they were boycotting the meeting because it wasn't being presented as a collaborative process. They are proposing that some housing be provided on SDC grounds and a clinic for clinical services. A family member has proposed a housing development on a small portion of SDC grounds. Santi Rogers, Director, DDS, noted that SDC won't close until there are suitable services for all residents. DDS will conduct a public meeting regarding the closure tentatively scheduled for Saturday, July 18, 2015 from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Dave Johnson, Chief Financial Officer, Report:

- Happy Fiscal New Year. NBRC did not need to borrow money, nor did we overspend our POS budget. NBRC also lived with our Operations budget. "Life is good".
- The Regional Center System was unsuccessful in obtaining a 10% wage increase for vendors.
- DDS's budget for Regional Centers increased by almost \$600M due to growth.
- No COLAs or rate reform.
- DDS's budget grows by 10% per year.

Regular Business Meeting July 1, 2015 – Page 5

- Governor Brown distributed the State Budget on May 15th which was passed with an additional \$60M for the Regional Center system. IHSS hours that were cut have been restored along with the 7% monetary cut effective July 1, 2015.
- The Legislature is considering a "Sin Tax", i.e., tax on alcohol, tobacco etc., to directly fund
 Developmental Disabilities. The Legislature is also trying to increase gas tax to repair California
 roads for example. By statute, all monies in the General Fund, are distributed to multiple recipients,
 i.e., half goes to the school system.

Fiscal Year 2015



Throughout this fiscal year NBRC has seen great movement in both our education and outreach efforts as well as continued new employee orientation. NBRC re-structuring, department growth, promotions and matriculation created continuous hiring opportunities. The Outreach Committee expanded its efforts to reach clinicians, education, county health and other stakeholders to improve their understanding of NBRC.  - ♣ The Governor's Christmas Tree Lighting: 159 views







Federal Revenue Department Board Report for Quarter 2, April-May-June (2015)

• Status: NBRC has 3,642 individuals enrolled in the Medicaid Waiver program as of June 30th, 2015. NBRC has met and exceeded its total goal for the fiscal year 2014-2015. This represents all NBRC clients eligible under the Lanterman Act.

California's Department of Developmental Services (DDS) completed a Medicaid Waiver audit May 11th - 22nd at NBRC. Preliminary findings from the DDS Medicaid Waiver audit were minimal and considered positive. NBRC will be presented the official audit findings from DDS later this year.

- Goals: A total 3,531 individuals were enrolled in the Medicaid Waiver program at the end of 13/14 fiscal year. Our semi-annual target for the 14/15 fiscal year was to enroll an additional 93 individuals and have 3,624 individuals enrolled into the Medicaid Waiver program by 6/30/15. NBRC has surpassed the target for the 14/15 fiscal year with a total of 3,642 individuals currently enrolled in the waiver. These targets have been established by DDS along with the requirement to add clients to the waiver monthly. Missing our target or not adding monthly can result in the withholding of federal funds in our operations budget and less POS (purchase of service) reimbursement.
- Training: NBRC Federal Revenue Department staff provided training to individual case management units to prepare for the DDS Medicaid Waiver Audit that took place on May 11th 22nd, 2015. The trainings included:
 - o An overview of General Audit Checklist requirements.
 - o The Federal Definition of Case Management.
 - o Title 19 notes/Targeted Case Management (TCM) notes.
 - o Completion of the Annual IPP Review form, as required per regulation.

NBRC Federal Revenue Department staff also provided training on Targeted Case Management (TCM) notes to individual service coordinators based off of the 2015 DDS Medicaid Waiver audit preliminary findings. The TCM drop-in workshop allowed for service coordinators to attend with TCM questions, comments, concerns. The goals of the TCM workshop were to:

- o Develop new template language based on the 2015 Medicaid Waiver preliminary audit findings.
- o Help service coordinators with TCM language that meets the criteria outlined in the Federal Definition of Case Management.
- o To answer any Title 19 documentation questions service coordinators might have.
- **DDS update:** The 1915(i) SPA (State Plan Amendment) that DDS submitted continues being reviewed for approval by Centers for Medicaid Services (CMS). Parts one and two have been approved, and the state has been enrolling eligible clients into the 1915(i) SPA. Once approval is completed, Regional Centers will begin implementing and managing

the program. The 1915(i) SPA will allow California to receive federal funding for POS services for individuals who may not qualify for Medicaid Waiver, but will not provide funds for operational expenditures.

- Agency Support: The Federal Revenue Department will continue to provide trainings and support to service coordinators and supervisors in order to assist with coming into compliance with Federal regulations. The Federal Revenue Department will do so by:
 - o Providing support with ongoing MW enrollment and duties.
 - o Help transition into the 1915(i) SPA.
 - o Track the Client Development Evaluation Report (CDER).
 - o Record and analyze forensic data integrity.
 - o Provide ongoing support to staff during all audits.



MEETING TIMELINES

The Intake Department is required to determine eligibility within 120 days. While this may seem like a long time, many factors including meeting with the applicant and families for observations, consultations, collecting records and testing may take some time and is imperative to our process in determining eligibility. Since January of 2014 the Intake Department has been 100% successful in meeting the 120 day timeline goal. In 2014 the Intake Department determined eligibility in an average of 105 days. From January 2015 through June 2015 the Intake Department has reduced the time to determine eligibility to an average of 97 days. In order to assist with reducing wait time for testing, an additional clinician was vendored in Napa and began ASD testing in February. In June a new vendored clinician began ASD testing in the Santa Rosa office, which will not only assist in getting applicants tested quicker, but will also reduce the amount of Sonoma County applicants having to travel to Napa for testing. In addition, several days were added to the Collaborative Autism Diagnostic Clinic in Sonoma County. The Intake Department also continues to access vendors to assist with intakes as needed, which also allows applicants to meet with an NBRC representative as soon as possible once it has been determined they are an appropriate referral.


ELIGIBLITY DIAGNOSES

Below represents a comparison of the % of diagnoses that applicants were made eligible under in Napa, Solano and Sonoma County in 2014 vs 2015 from January through June. Intakes include individuals over 3 as well as children from Early Intervention turning 3.



INTAKE REFERRALS FOR INDIVIDUALS OVER 3

From January through June the intake department received 161 intake referrals compared to 215 from January through June in 2014, which is a 25% reduction. This included applicants over 3 sent to NBRC by doctors, schools, the court system and friends and families in the community. The dire need for dental sedation was discussed with Rita Edmond Norris providing a horrific example of what her son went through when he experienced a dental emergency. Karen Farnsworth stated that DHHS is proposing an initial dental visit annually before dental sedation can occur. She and Alyssa are advocating that this not occur.
- ARCA: Bob stated that the next ARCA meeting will be on August 20th and 21st at Harbor Regional Center.
- Dr. Michi Gates: POS for Community Care Facilities will remain until cancelled and Day and Work programs will remain until cancelled for at least another year. SLS POS will be done on a triannual basis now. NBRC Staff will create a 2015/16 and 2016/17 plan for closure at SDC by Friday, July 17th. Michi and Bob will continue to meet with SDC staff and parents related to the closure and will only support placements where community resources exist. A new forensic home in Vacaville is up and running. A new Nurse Consultant was hired and New Adult Service Coordination Unit has been created and will be supervised by Rafael. Self determination advisory committee could use more Sonoma County Consumer/Family representation.
- Disaster Preparedness: No report.
- CASACC Vendor Chair Conference Call: Mike was unable to attend this call.

Community Concerns/Clarifications: None.

Group reports were given:

- The Napa Solano Vendor Group did not meet.
- The **Sonoma Vendor Group** met and had wrap up discussion from the Legislative breakfast as well as the vendor survey.
- CDD North Bay: No report.
- NBHC: No report.
- **Public Relations and Outreach**: We will coordinate our vendor fair with the All NBRC Staff training day this Fall.
- Trade Associations: Linda reported on the CSLN conference is April 15th 17th and the wonderful wedding of 2 consumers officiated by Holly Mitchell. CSLN is in support of AB 286, the SLS 15 hours of Behavioral Training if it is funded. Everyone needs to contact the Governor related to the 10 Campaign. Mike reported that the California Respite Association has a draft of trailer bill language to help fund the unfunded mandates such as the City specific minimum wage increases which currently require a DDS health and safety exception. SB 490 would allow vendors with a good audit to skip the following 2 years, but as Bob Hamilton pointed out would probably pay more because of the back year auditing required.
