- Anne Evans shared about a multicultural community event and genealogy conference.
- Derek Hearhtower shared about an event on March 14th at 1pm at the Santa Rosa library hosted by Common Ground Society. Derek also expressed their concern on HCBS rights and the violation of North Bay Industries.

PRESENTATION: REIMBURSEMENT – SOCIAL RECREATION SERVICES

Beth DeWitt, Director of Client Services; Isabel Calder, Chief Financial Officer; & Claudia Ritchie, Director of Equity & Engagement; presented the reimbursement process for social recreation services. The presentation can be found as an attachment to the March board meeting packet on NBRC’s website.

Q&A from Board Members

- What if someone doesn’t speak in English or Spanish? Is there another staff member available that speaks another language?
 - o NBRC has a staff member in Fiscal that speaks Tagalog, Service Coordinators that speak a number of different languages, and interpreters available if needed.

Q&A with Public

- What if your Service Coordinator doesn't share all this information that was presented to us here? I’m just getting to know this whole process.
 - o NBRC will post the presentation separately on the NBRC website.

Follow Up Items

- Courtney Singleton, Director of Community Services, to track outreach efforts to service providers about their willingness to become regional center vendors (document reasons for refusal such as paperwork burden, payment-after-service concerns), compile findings, and report back to the board with data in approximately six months.
- Consider implementation of kiosk computers and supporting documentation at each office to assist families with e-billing setup and submission of receipts for reimbursement.
- Research and draft a formal process describing under what circumstances a service provider can prepay social recreation services as a pass-through and clarify criteria and procedures for authorizing and reimbursing those pass-through arrangements, then report findings to the board.
- Research whether the Board Opportunity Fund could be used to pay up-front for social recreation services for families without access to vendors or Financial Management Services (FMS), including limitations and financial implications, and report back with recommendations.

REVIEW OF APPROVED CONTRACTS OVER \$250,000

Courtney Singleton, Director of Community Services, shared an overview of the recently approved contracts over \$250,000. These contracts can be found on pages 40-43 in the March Board Meeting packet.

- Joanne Giardello, Board Member, inquired about the specialized interventions and how success is measured in children's crisis homes.
- Courtney Singleton, Director of Community Services, explained that success is measured by moving

individuals to lower levels of care or permanent housing, with a focus on reducing inappropriate behavior and stabilizing individuals.

- Courtney explained the training process for staff and the involvement of Board Certified Behavior Analysts (BCBA) and other professionals.

TREASURER'S REPORT –

Treasurer's Report be approved as submitted.

Christopher Bennett, Board Treasurer, reviewed the Treasurer's Report. A summary of the Board Opportunity Fund and the CFO board report can be found as an attachment to the March 2026 board packet.

- Doug Cleveland Board Opportunity Fund
 - The Opportunity Fund had an ending balance of \$64,979.30 as of January 31, 2026.
 - There was one (1) deposit in the amount of \$1,800 for the retirement donation for Debbie Adams.
- Operations – Current Fiscal Year 2025/2026
 - NBRC paid a total amount of \$24,628,429 for all operation expenditures, including Senior Companion Program, Mental Health Services Act, and LACC through January 31, 2026.
 - We are at 58% through this fiscal year and our Operations expenditures through the end of January are at 55% for this fiscal year.
 - Operations expenditure has increased and is currently averaging \$3.6 million per month. With five months left in this fiscal year, we are closely monitoring the budget to ensure we complete the year within our budget allocation.
- Purchase of Service (POS) – Current Fiscal Year 2025/2026
 - NBRC paid a total of \$343,552,238 for POS expenditure through January 31, 2026. With the B-4 allocation, DDS has increased our contract spending authority. POS expenditures associated with rate reform and Minimum Wage, effective January 1, 2026, will be well within our contract allocation.
- As of February 27, 2026, NBRC's cash availability is just over \$92,298,871 million. Of this amount, \$40 million was invested in January earning \$118,187 in interest through a 30-day CD. We are re-investing \$50 million in March 2026.
- We anticipate receiving just over \$55 million for the January State Claim on March 6th.

- Success Stories will be shared at the next Annual Board Meeting on April 1st.
- Updates on various initiatives, including rate reform, office renovations, and the dental desensitization clinic.

- Joanne Giardello, Board Member, reminded the community about the Spring Resource Fair on April 23rd in Fairfield.
- Cheryl Snavely, Board Member, shared that the board development committee sent out a letter requesting donations to the board opportunity fund describing the impact the funds would make on the community.
- Christopher Bennett, Board Vice President, shared about his experience attending Grassroots Day on March 2nd and 3rd.

GENERAL PUBLIC COMMENT –

- Michael Toschi shared he was not aware of a higher-level care facility that was mentioned in the contracts approved and the need for a change in case management representation.
 - o Gabriel Rogin, Executive Director, reiterated that a staff member will follow up after the meeting to discuss his questions and concerns.

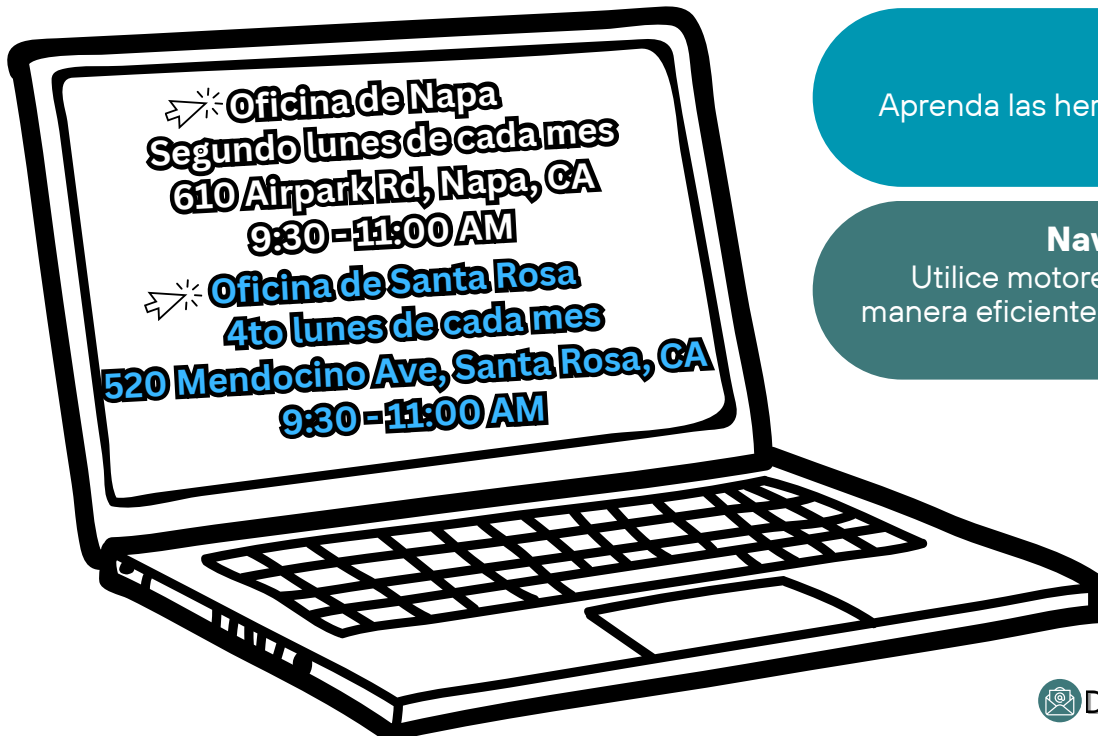

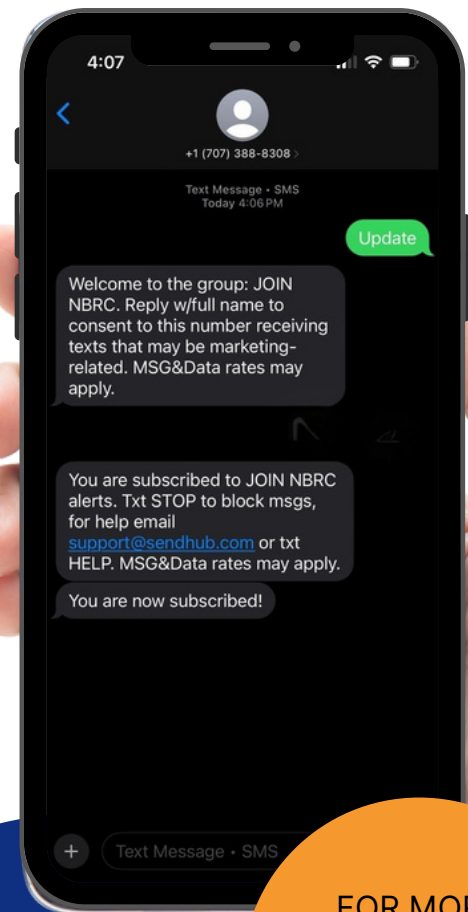

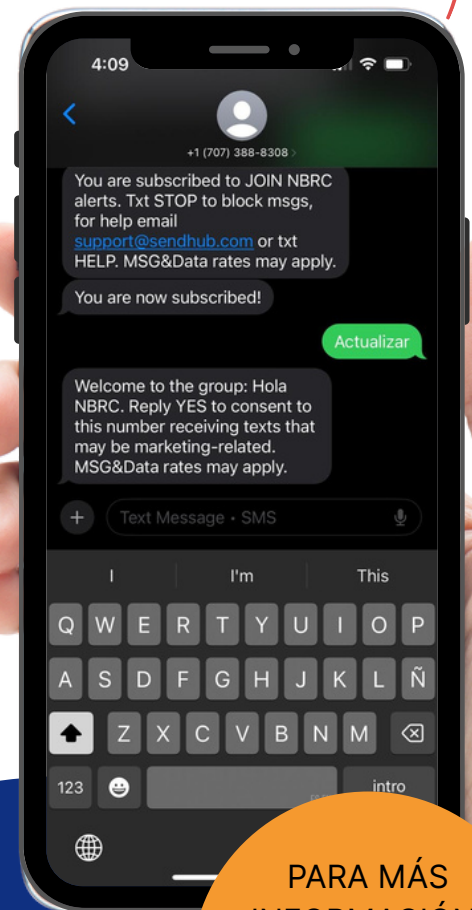
