Andrea Bednarova, Treasurer, reviewed the Treasurer's Report. A summary of the Board Opportunity Fund and the CFO board report can be found in the December 2024 board packet.

- Operations
 - The operations expenditure represents 31% of our total operations budget to date. As of October 31st, 33% of the fiscal year has elapsed.
 - NBRC is still waiting for the remaining Community Placement Plan (CPP) funding from the Department of Developmental Services (DDS). Once the full CPP funding is received for CPP, the salary and benefits will be adjusted and reported under the appropriate section. For now, the CPP salaries and benefits remain reported under our general operation expenses.
 - We continue to make progress with our hiring. As of November 26th, we have 346 employees.
 - $_{\odot}$ $\,$ We have new hires scheduled to start in December and January.
- Purchase of Service (POS)
 - The POS expenditures represent 30% of the total POS budget. As of October 31st, 33% of the fiscal year has elapsed.
 - Rate Reform Directives are being distributed for the upcoming January 1, 2025, rate model implementation. As expected, the implementation will be a huge undertaking for staff. DDS recognizes the amount of work that lies ahead and understands the challenges in projecting POS expenditures for 2025. With that said, the annual projections due on December 10th have been postponed until further notice.
 - In the meantime, NBRC is closely monitoring the POS expenditures to ensure there is adequate spending authority in the POS budget.
- Cashflow
 - As of November 26, 2024, the bank balance is \$100,462,101 (\$20,462,101 cash availability and \$80 mil in a 45-day CD). NBRC has earned \$386,667 in interest through October. For November and December, NBRC is anticipating \$540,000 in additional interest.

Summary

This Enhanced Behavioral Support Home (EBSH) was developed to serve women with challenging behavioral needs that are moving from Porterville Developmental Center, other locked settings and individuals being deflected from locked settings. This is a four (4) bedroom home, with each individual having their own room. A full-time administrator is responsible for the operation of the home. All staff must be Licensed Psychiatric Technicians or Registered Behavior Technicians. There is a base staffing ratio of one lead staff on every shift. Additional staffing levels are determined based on each individual's needs, through their Individual Program Plan (IPP). An additional purchase of service is put in place to fund this staffing, separate from this contract amount. The facility budget is approved by NBRC and certified by The Department of Developmental Services. This contract is for the facility costs for the home. When the first individual moves into the home, the facility cost is paid to the EBSH vendor. These homes are monitored on a monthly basis by NBRC's Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA), quarterly by each client's NBRC Service Coordinator, quarterly by NBRC's Quality Assurance Staff, semiannually by The Department of Developmental Services' BCBA, and annually unannounced by Community Care Licensing.
