NATIONAL CORE INDICATORS (NCI) SURVEY SELECTED FINDINGS



What is NCI?



NCI is used across states to confidentially assess quality outcomes of developmental disability services. NCI demonstrates how publicly funded supports are impacting people's lives and providing insight into where things can be improved.



What Information is Collected?

The core indicators are standard measures used across states to assess the outcomes of services provided to individuals and families. Indicators address key areas of concern including employment, rights, service planning, community inclusion, choice, and health and safety.



Who is Surveyed?

There are four types of surveys used in California.

- Adult In-Person
- Child Family written survey
- Adult Family written survey
- Family Guardian written survey



Who Collects the Data?

The State Council on Developmental Disabilities collects the data across the state of California through face to face interviews with adult consumers, as well as through surveys mailed to families of children and adults with developmental disabilities.



Welfare and Institutions Code Section 4571 requires:


- Regional centers to annually present data collected from the NCI Surveys in a public meeting.
- Gather public input on data presented
- 60 days after the public meeting, NBRC must report back to the Department of Developmental Services (DDS) with recommendations and plans to use the information gathered during the public meeting



The In-Person Survey is conducted face-to-face with an individual who is 18 years or older and receives at least one service from the regional center, in addition to case management.

Surveyed: 411 individuals







Did the IPP meeting include people you wanted to be there?



WHO CHOSE THE PLACE WHERE YOU LIVE?




Do you have a key to your house?


