

What is a "caseload ratio" and why is it important?

Represents the number of clients assigned to each Service Coordinator

Considered important indicator of providing good service to our clients



North Bay Regional Center Caseload Ratios

March 2023 DDS Caseload Ratio Report (as of 3/1/23)

- Medicaid Waiver Ratio = 1:76 vs. DDS Requirement = 1:62
 - ▶ 15 Full Time Service Coordinators needed to meet the required caseload ratio*
- 0-5-Year-Old Ratio = 1:58 vs. DDS Requirement = 1:40
 - Combination of Early Start & Young Children
 - 17 Full Time Service Coordinators needed to meet the required caseload ratio*
- ▶ All Others Ratio = 1:75 vs. DDS Requirement = 1:66
 - 5 Service Coordinators needed to meet the required caseload ratio*


North Bay Regional Center Caseload Ratios

March 2023 DDS Caseload Ratio Report (Continued) (as of 3/1/23)

- Complex Case Ratio = 1:21 vs. DDS Requirement = 1:25
 - NBRC is currently meeting this required caseload ratio
- Low to No POS Ratio = 1:21 vs. DDS Requirement = 1:40
 - NBRC is currently meeting this required caseload ratio


*NBRC needs a combined total of 37 additional Service Coordinators to meet the caseload ratio requirements for individuals who fall within the Medicaid Waiver, Early Start, and All Other category, but not including Complex Cases

North Bay Regional Center is considered a "small" Regional Center with 9,711 clients as of March 1, 2023

Regional Center Statewide Average Caseload Ratio is 1:76 NBRC Average Caseload Ratio is 1:75

Costs to Meet Caseload Ratio Requirements

Projected cost to meet DDS' Caseload Ratio Requirements

Cost Per NBRC Service Coordinator

- ▶ \$65,273 = Average NBRC Service Coordinator annual salary
- \$22,193 = Average NBRC annual benefits (34%)
- \$87,465 = Total average NBRC Service Coordinator salary/benefit package

Total Cost

- NBRC will need 45 Service Coordinators to meet DDS' Caseload Ratio Requirements
 - ▶ 20 more to meet MedWaiver and All Others DDS Requirements
 - ▶ 17 more to meet the Early Start and Young Children DDS Requirements which was recently reduced from 1:62 to 1:40
 - ▶ 8 more to meet the Complex Caseloads Requirement
- Total cost = nearly \$4 million (a significant increase from last year)

^{*}The total average reflects the salary and benefits approved in 12/2022. A total increase of \$8,765.



North Bay Regional Center's Efforts to Meet Caseload Ratios

- As of July 1, 2023, NBRC currently has a total of 154 Service Coordinators on staff (increase of 21 SCs since last year)
 - ▶ 144 Service Coordinators (increase of 20)
 - ▶ 10 Senior Service Coordinators (increase of 1)
- ▶ NBRC is currently recruiting for 33 Service Coordinators
 - We have added 17 "growth" positions so far in the 23/24 Fiscal Year
- NBRC has hired 27 Service Coordinators since January 1, 2023
- We are working diligently to identify potential applicants, utilizing online sources such as Indeed and BetterTeam, and continue to offer an Employee Referral Bonus for employees who refer qualified candidates who are hired by NBRC. We are also seeking to hire a Human Resources Recruiter.

North Bay Regional Center's Challenges in Meeting Caseload Ratios

Continued historically low unemployment figures

Legislative changes reducing caseload ratios to 1:40 in Early Start and in Young Children Units

Legislative changes to eligibility criteria resulting in significant client growth.

Legislative changes requiring new focus on children between 3-5 years old
